At the final event of PTP's last season, the Valley's premiere of Greg & Mark Runnels' film *Breakfast With Bukowski*, I was invited to read Bukowski's poem "Roll the Dice."

if you're going to try, go all the way.
this could mean losing girlfriends,
wives, relatives, jobs and maybe your mind.

Okay. Check, check, check, check and check. You see, the difficulty of "all the way" lies in knowing where it will finally take you. And recognizing that this destination is, finally, unknowable. How, then, do we as an organization stay true to our vision of theater while simultaneously opening ourselves to unexpected opportunities?

This last season, opportunity presented itself in a perfect storm of artistic integrity and institutional context: PTP's production of *To Kill a Mockingbird* at the Gallo Center. Lee's tale is the quintessential expression of the kind of story PTP wants to tell, affirming the power individuals hold to affect change in the world at large. Acting through generosity and empathy can be every bit as resounding as an MK-47. Because our 'bottom line' has always been so modest, we have successfully skirted the need to approach a project primarily because it will generate revenue. Our primary concern is in the story being told. In *Mockingbird*, we were able to tell a story with conviction that was also hugely successful.

I'm not sure if I'm fully expressing it -- I tend to sneak up on topics-- but, there's a tightrope to walk here. Our solution is to remain open to opportunity. It's the philosophy we espouse, so I guess we'd better. We have two productions scheduled for the Gallo Center this year, and it must be said that one of them is a world premiere, so hats off to Gallo for taking a chance with an untested work. The other three will be here at our artistic home. I always present our season to you in the hope that you, too, will find our work challenging, engaging and entertaining. Looking forward to the next leg on the road leading "all the way." Come along with us. I'd sure love to see you at the theater.
